



## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Beaufort County School District Family,

The 2009-2010 school year yielded positive trends for student achievement and school performance. State achievement highlights include: All six middle schools jumped a level on Absolute Ratings on the new PASS test, and twelve of seventeen elementary schools improved one or more rating levels. The number of schools identified as "at risk" by the state dropped from four to one. Schools met or exceeded state averages in 7 of 30 areas, compared with 1 of 24 areas previously. Nine schools were recognized by the State Board for high levels of achievement/improvement, earning Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards. Closing the Achievement Gap awards were earned by six schools. Despite these trends, Beaufort County School District's Absolute Rating for 2009 remained Below Average. On federal measures, twelve Beaufort County Schools met Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), a three-fold increase over 2009, and the number of objectives met increased in 23 of 27 schools. On the national norm-referenced test Measures of Academic Progress (MAP), significant achievements included 100% of kindergarten goals met in reading and math. Elementary reading goals met increased from 21% in 2009 to 46% in 2010, and math goals met increased from 30% to 59%. Other recognitions included five schools named Red Carpet Schools, bringing the number of award-winning schools to 14. The district and all schools earned national accreditation for the first time through AdvancEd. Key initiatives included extending learning time for 20 days for students scoring below the state's minimum standards; establishing a 200-day year for persistently underperforming schools; implementing Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS); and aggressively addressing childhood obesity. In asset management, Red Cedar Elementary, Riverview Charter, and Early Childhood Centers at Bluffton and MCRiley opened in 2009; Pritchardville Elementary, Bluffton Middle, and Whale Branch Early College High Schools will open in 2010. Financially, the School District sustained the high credit rating earned in 2007, resulting in millions saved in interest earnings. We appreciate Beaufort County citizens' steadfast support for increased student achievement and success. We invite community members to visit our schools, volunteer with some students, and get involved in your public schools, where Learning Leads the Way.
