



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Fairfield County School District is a county-wide school district that serves over 3,000 students within nine schools. As we continue our diligent work towards closing the achievement gap, we have achieved various accomplishments. Fairfield Central High School was named one of the "Best High Schools in America" by US News and World Report Magazine and was selected as a Bronze School for 2009. Fairfield Central High School was one of only 22 schools in South Carolina to make this national list. Fairfield Middle School, a Palmetto Priority School, improved from meeting 15 of 21 objectives in 2008 to meeting 19 out of 21 objectives in 2009. In addition, four schools made adequate yearly progress (AYP), as compared to 1 school during the 2008-2009 school year. Fairfield Magnet School for Math and Science (formerly Fairfield Intermediate School) met AYP for the first time since 2006. Also, the district achieved nearly a ten point increase in the district's graduation rate from the previous year.

An important component of enhanced student achievement is ensuring the connection between students and learning. In Fairfield County, a thriving elementary magnet school, a promising Art Works program, and a flourishing Career and Technology Center help students realize and articulate their innate gifts. For students who need enhanced academic assistance, the District offers afterschool and alternative programs for students to achieve standards mastery. In addition, STAR academy was implemented to offer a unique instructional setting for overaged middle school students to accelerate learning and graduate with peers. Continuous academic support is given through the implementation and monitoring of such innovative programs and techniques as Balanced Literacy and Mathematics, embedded intervention in all schools, credit recovery, Making Middle Grades Work, High Schools that Work, and Best-Practice Professional Development Training for teachers and parents, as well as various instructional activities integrating Mathematics and Science. Our district utilizes Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) twice annually for formative purposes; Dominion is utilized as a progress-monitoring tool to measure literacy; quarterly standards-based assessments are administered to appraise student achievement and academic growth on our South Carolina state standards.

The decision-making process for Fairfield County School District is based upon our district strategic plan, with a focus on teaching and learning, parental and community involvement, building leadership capacity, effective communication, and achievement beyond academics. All stakeholders are committed to our goal and vision of successfully educating each child within our district. We will continue to work towards our goal through the continued growth within the areas of educational leadership, student achievement, and stakeholder commitment.

Together with the community, we will continue our progress, close the achievement gap, and bring the vision of "Excellence by Example" to life for every child in Fairfield County.
