



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

This has been another school year of great student achievement and academic excellence. Kershaw County School District (KCS D) averages were higher than the state averages in 19 of the 24 possible 2009 PASS categories. Five schools—Blaney Elementary, Lugoff Elementary, Camden High, Lugoff-Elgin High, and North Central High—were recognized by the State Board of Education in the Palmetto Gold and Silver program for closing the achievement gap for at least one historically underachieving student group, while North Central High was also recognized for the second straight year for high levels of academic achievement and high rates of student academic improvement. None of the district's schools received an At Risk rating on the state-issued school report cards. Twenty-one more Kershaw County teachers earned National Board certification (the highest credential available in the teaching profession), while one teacher earned his recertification. This brings the total number of district teachers who are National Board certified to 153, or 17 percent of the teaching staff, compared to only 14 percent statewide who have the certification.

All of the district's teachers and high school students received laptops to use, while a K-8 technology initiative supplied interactive whiteboards for every elementary and middle school classroom and laptops on carts for use by those students.

Three projects were completed in Phase One of the \$102.2 million facilities-equalization program: a new LEED-certified facility for Jackson School, a six-classroom wing at Blaney Elementary, and a spring sports complex at Camden High.

The district's performance has received statewide and national recognition at all levels. Lugoff-Elgin Middle was the first middle school in the state to earn recertification as a "School to Watch." Five schools—Baron DeKalb Elementary, Blaney Elementary, Doby's Mill Elementary, Leslie M. Stover Middle, and Lugoff Elementary—were named Red Carpet Schools, bringing the total number of Kershaw County schools who currently hold this honor to 13. Lugoff-Elgin High math teacher Robert Ondere was named a Milken National Educator and received a \$25,000 award. District Teacher of the Year Melody Johnson was named one of the five honor roll teachers in the South Carolina Teacher of the Year Program. Jackson School students finished third in a regional FIRST Lego League contest and participated in the state finals. Doby's Mill Elementary was named a SC Green Steps School for its environmental efforts. ATEC nursing and health science students won 29 medals in the Health Occupations Students of America (HOSA) state competition. Blaney Elementary's archery team finished third in the Department of Natural Resources' state competition and advanced to the national finals. Lugoff-Elgin High's wrestling and baseball teams were AAA state champions. Student body presidents from Camden High and Lugoff-Elgin High helped organize the first-ever joint fundraising project for the United Way of Kershaw County. Together, the schools raised \$12,988. Seventy percent of the 605 Class of 2010 high school graduates went on to postsecondary education; they earned \$6,661,646 in college scholarships.
