



## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

The McCormick County School District experienced many exciting and challenging opportunities during the 2009-2010 school year. Our board of trustees and superintendent of schools, along with district staff, participated in the completion of our educational complex with the addition of the McCormick High School to that location. We are all very excited about the education complex and the programs that we will be able to introduce to the educational system in McCormick.

McCormick, like all the other school districts in the state of South Carolina, has experienced significant declines in revenue from the South Carolina General Assembly this school year. Our district has been fortunate in that we have not had to furlough employees during the 2009-2010 school year. However, with the anticipated shortfalls for 2010-2011, it may be a possibility that we have to explore.

Our schools have been involved in lots of great activities this school year for staff development and student learning. Some of the programs that we have implemented this year include the software program Education 2020, Classworks, and more staff development related to Measures of Academic Progress. The district, like many others in South Carolina, is using Measures of Academic Progress as in-house benchmark tests. We have also been working on ways to interpret data from various formats and sources to improve teaching and learning.

We are very fortunate to have a caring and dedicated staff in McCormick. Our staff and students are our greatest resources. The district is committed to providing the support needed to ensure that our students receive the best education possible. One strategy that began this school year is a review of the planning process. As a result of this review, the district completed an application to become a SACS Accredited District. This is one of many strategies being implemented in the 2010-2011 school year.
