

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Hilton Head Island School for the Creative Arts (HHISCA) is an arts-focused school of choice. In the fifth year of operation, the school again had an all-time high enrollment of 729 students for the 2009-2010 school year. The school was recognized at the state level this year for its academic achievements and its accomplishments in the arts. Continued parental involvement and support help make our school a leader in the district.

HHISCA again received the Palmetto Silver Award. Our report card rating was average, and we maintained an improvement rating of good. In addition, students performed extremely well on the Measure of Academic Performance (MAP) tests. HHISCA met district expectations in grades one through five in math.

The South Carolina Alliance for Arts Education notified us that HHISCA was again selected to be awarded the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts Schools of Excellence in Arts Education Award. This award recognizes schools that have done an outstanding job of making the arts an essential part of the education of students. HHISCA continues to provide arts-education classes to all students in Visual Art, Music, Dance and Theatre. All students work with at least one artist-in-residence each year and attend an arts-related field trip. Grade-level productions in full costume at the high school theatre and art and music exhibitions open to the community give all students excellent opportunities in the arts. For the first time, two HHISCA students placed at the state level in the PTA Reflections art competition.

The 2009-2010 fourth graders were invited to present an encore of "Charleston." This original production by dance teacher, Patti Maurer, based on the Jenkins Orphanage in Charleston, took our students to perform at the historic Sottile Theatre at the Charleston Jazz Initiative Legends Festival in Charleston. This festival is an annual event of the College of Charleston's School of the Arts and the Piccolo Spoleto Festival.

Our Walk One World Walking Club, a before-school program, brought statewide recognition to our district. HHISCA was one of eight schools in South Carolina to earn a \$500 grant and, in May, the state gold medal and \$5,000.00 from the All-Health Team, a partnership between the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC), Blue Cross Blue Shield of South Carolina, and WIS-TV, to promote healthy lifestyles.

A supportive PTA and an active School Improvement Council continued work to increase achievement, support the arts and wellness, and review the School Renewal Plan. These efforts support the school and district's vision and mission statements and the improvement efforts at our school. Both organizations worked with school staff to write and implement over \$250,000.00 in grants. We are proud of efforts and remain committed to making our school one of the best in the country.
