

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Congaree Elementary School is a public, rural elementary school located southwest of the Columbia Metropolitan Airport in South Congaree, a community of approximately 2,500 residents. First opened in 1959, Congaree Elementary serves just over 400 students in the 2nd – 5th grades. Congaree Elementary School has been fully accredited through SACS since 1971. The mission of Congaree Elementary School is “Creating Excellence Through Effort!” Our school motto shares the feeling one gets upon entering the building: “At Congaree, our character always counts!”

New initiatives this school year include purchasing over 2000 new books for the Media Center, expanding our literature library, adding to classroom libraries, and completing the purchase of LCD projectors and document cameras for every classroom. Students regularly work on reading and math skills through Compass Learning, both in the classroom and the computer lab. Our Professional Learning Communities emphasized “kid-watching,” Morning Meeting, and writing instruction. Title I tutors and our READ 120 staff provided small group instruction for every student 4 days per week resulting in an increased interest in reading among students.

Our School Improvement Council and Parent Teacher Organization actively support the teaching and learning at Congaree Elementary school through various projects. PTO contributed toward the purchase of new playground equipment, including several pieces for our special needs students. PTO also purchased new pencil sharpeners for all the classes and sponsored a Family Fun Night, roller skating night, and spring dance. Our school raised funds for the American Cancer Society, the Ronald McDonald House, and \$2000 for Jump Rope for Heart. Our school also sponsored food drives for Harvest Hope food bank and God’s Helping Hands food pantry. To encourage parent participation and involvement we hosted a Family Literacy Night, Family Math & Science Night, several book fairs, parenting classes, a Veteran’s Day celebration, Grandparents’ Week, and Author’s Tea. Quarterly Awards Assemblies were held such as, Rewarding Outstanding Pupil Efforts Success Program (R.O.P.E.S), Bringing up a grade (B.U.G), and monthly awards such as Congaree Chieftain. Yearly awards ceremonies are held at the end of the school year. Students participated in character education, Congaree Careers, after school drama club, after school Chorus, after school writing club, before school Compass Club, Pass test Pep rally, special needs awareness classes, and a before school walking club. In the fall and spring, students engaged in literary conversations following, “One School, Two Books, and Three Weeks.” The school recently received the Kohl’s Grant for the beautification of the outdoor classroom and other improvements to the school grounds.

We thank our parents and community volunteers for their support and time spent investing in the education of the children at Congaree Elementary School. We look forward to continued improvements in teaching and learning in the year to come.
