

Keowee Elementary School is a Kindergarten-5th grade school that serves 310 students in a rural area of Oconee County. During 2009-10, Keowee Elementary was proud to achieve numerous awards. For the third time, Keowee was awarded the SC Red Carpet Award. While maintaining its family-friendly atmosphere, the school strives to provide data-driven, differentiated and individualized instruction. These efforts were recognized by the state as Keowee was named both a Closing the Achievement Gap and a Palmetto Gold Award-winning school.
