

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

With the closing of two older Title 1 elementary schools, Allen L. Code and James N. Kellett in June 2009, Blue Ridge Elementary opened its doors in August with an enrollment of 680 students and 120 staff members. Blue Ridge was named in honor of the former Blue Ridge High School in Seneca and the beautiful Blue Ridge mountain range surrounding the Upstate. The strong community connections and involvement of both Code and Kellett continue as the cornerstone of our school.

As a professional learning school with Clemson University, Blue Ridge is a teaching laboratory to Clemson University's education majors. Their involvement has strengthened both programs as well as benefiting our students.

Our staff's focus is on teaching and learning. Both Code and Kellett made AYP last year and students from both schools have shown increased MAP scores throughout the school year. To ensure that our students continue making academic gains, administrators and coaches schedule goal setting conferences with students.

Professional development at Blue Ridge is systemic throughout our day. During grade-level planning days, our science, math, and literacy coaches have worked effectively with the staff to integrate standards across the curriculum and develop benchmark assessments. In addition to implementing the Reading Recovery program, our five highly trained teachers work collaboratively with first and second grade teachers to teach small group-guided reading lessons.

As a recipient of the 21st Century Community Learning Center grant, approximately 120 students participate in afterschool programs from 2:45-5:30. Students participate in technology enhanced learning activities, such as learning to use digital cameras, editing digital movies, and Lego robotics. This year the students worked with our local community theater to produce and perform "Snow White" for our community.

To emphasize high standards for academics and behavior, students in grades 1-5 are recognized every nine weeks. Parents, teachers and students come together to celebrate students' successes.

Blue Ridge Elementary's goal is to remain a source of pride for our community, maintain high academic and behavior expectations, always welcome community involvement, and encourage our children to be active and committed citizens of Oconee County. Blue Ridge is an elementary school where we believe that all children can achieve!
