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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

All stakeholders at Hilton Head Island High School worked together this year to prepare for our first AdvancED District Accreditation. This process allowed for all to work together to evaluate our baseline and to raise the bar. We also had the opportunity to complete Application B for the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program as well as complete our IB Self Study. We were able to bring APEX into our curriculum as well as TCA SAT Test Prep. Every faculty member mapped their curriculum using Rubicon. We had our first National Youth Science Award winner in over a decade, as well as a Scholastic Art National Silver Medal. We also had a Commended Scholar for the National Merit Scholarship program and continued to build a strong Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) program. We built a solid Ninth Grade Academy for every freshman with a daily MYP class. We continued our advisor/advisee program called Connections. We had 84 students enrolled in our IB classes, with many more in Advanced Placement course work and honors classes.

HHS has 36 athletic teams and 23 clubs. Our students brought home state titles in Girls' Cross Country, Boys' Cross Country, and Girls' Tennis. Our athletes brought home individual state titles in Swimming, Track, and Wrestling.

The State Department awarded us with the Red Carpet Award as well as the Palmetto Silver Award and the Palmetto Silver Award for closing the achievement gap. It is without a doubt that faculty, staff, parents, and the students soar at the Nest!
