



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## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The mission of Crescent High School is to develop responsible graduates.

Tim Keown was named Crescent's Teacher of the Year. Ann Ellis, Treva Tiberghien, and Amanda Pinson received a \$50,000 Transitions Grant. Leslie Martin received a Donors Choose Grant.

Our Media Center hosted Banned Books Week, Teen Read Week, and the 5th Annual International Fair.

This year we offered AP classes in English, US History, and World History. Sixteen students participated in dual-credit classes with local colleges and universities.

To date, our senior class has received over 2.9 million dollars in scholarships. There were twenty-seven students eligible for a Life Scholarship to a two-year institution and fifty students eligible for a Life Scholarship to a four-year institution. There were five students who qualified for a Palmetto Fellow scholarship.

Our FFA Chapter received a Bronze Award. Our Volleyball team won the region championship, one student was named Player of the Year, and Leslie Martin was named Coach of the Year. Softball finished as state runner up, one student was named Player of the Year, and Gary Adams was named Coach of the Year.
