




READING – GRADE 8 (2009)

The school and community work closely together to meet the needs of all students in providing a quality education that encompasses a broad range of instructional programs and extracurricular activities.

The school is proud of its many achievements and does not let our small size limit our accomplishments. We continue to make outstanding academic progress and exceeded the state average on HSAP scores and graduation rate. This past year we switched to the semester block schedule, which has benefited student achievement and instruction. Our graduating class had many scholarship recipients. Our students achieved success in various academic and vocational competitions around the state. Our band made it to the state competition and our drama department put on an outstanding performance of Beauty and the Beast. Our athletic teams and athletes received many honors this year, including region titles in football, tennis, and golf. Our basketball team played for the upper state championship and our football team won the state championship.

We continue to expose our students to the world of work. We had a Career Day featuring local and area businesses. Many students participated in job-shadowing opportunities, with numerous students obtaining employment through the School-To-Work Program.
