



## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The Youth Academy is made up of grades K - 12. There is an elementary school, grades K - 5, and secondary school, grades 6 - 12. The school has received an "unsatisfactory" rating and is currently receiving Title I funding due to the high percentage of students eligible for free and reduced lunch.

In addition to state and district mandated assessments, MAP, PASS, HSAP, EOC, Academy Math & Reading, we use the APEX Learning and the American School to give us an accurate picture of needs connected to student achievement.

Our corrective action entails that we significantly decrease management authority at the school levels; restructure the internal organization; and appoint an outside expert to advise the school in its inability to make adequate yearly progress. Teachers are being trained and evaluated to make sure that they meet the highly qualified standards to reach the students' educational needs.

There is a strong need to improve the communication between the community, parents, teachers, students, the district, and the school. The Youth Academy will strive to provide a safe environment, promote self-esteem, and educate all students to become independent lifelong learners and productive citizens. We will also focus on becoming the pride of the community, a place where all students are empowered to excel to high academic standards and are guided by highly-qualified professionals and dedicated citizens.

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
