

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

The 2009-2010 school year was very rewarding for Bamberg-Ehrhardt Middle School. We continued to show growth in all subject areas, as indicated by our PASS results. Bamberg-Ehrhardt Middle School met AYP for the first time in school history. BEMS students also boasted a 100% pass rate on the Algebra I and English I End of Course Tests.

In 2009, BEMS implemented a positive behavior incentive program. "Raiders Rock" was a huge success, as reflected by our decreased discipline referral rate. BEMS, in conjunction with the School Improvement Council, created The Future Leaders of Tomorrow Program. This program focused on career and character awareness for all 8th grade students.

Bamberg-Ehrhardt Middle School continues to place student achievement at the forefront. Teacher and staff reductions have impacted our class size but not our dedication and motivation. We continue to seek innovative ideas and methods that will best serve our students in their academic and social growth.
