


PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Kennedy Middle School has approximately nine hundred and twenty-nine students, of whom sixty-six percent are Caucasian and thirty-four percent are minority. Thirty-three percent are on either free or reduced lunch. The school has two self-contained special education classes, two resource classes, an English as Second Language class, and two hundred and seventy-one students enrolled in the Gifted and Talented program.

Academically, the students have scored well above the state and district averages on all standardized tests. Students are heterogeneously grouped in grades six and seven, and, because of high school credit course offerings, are homogeneously grouped in the eighth grade. All students are offered a daily advisor-advisee period and one period of language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies daily. In addition, each student has a minimum of four exploratory course offerings yearly. To support the academic program, all students participate in Accelerated Reading and the CAI (Computer Assisted Instruction) Lab. Students who are experiencing academic difficulties are offered tutoring by parent volunteers and Beta Club members, an enrichment class, and an after school tutorial program.

A wide variety of extracurricular opportunities are provided for students through clubs, athletics, intramurals, and mini-courses. Students participate in a variety of service learning and character education activities. The KMS National Beta Club inducted one hundred and thirty students this year, bringing our total membership to three hundred and fifty-six. Two of our seventh grade students have been invited to attend the Duke TIP Summer Center. Eight seventh grade students have been invited to attend the Duke Summer Academy. Our band produced one All State, nineteen Region and twenty-nine All County band members. Our volleyball team and boys' basketball team were conference champions. In summary, Kennedy Middle School strives to ensure that every student achieves success.
