

## PASS PERFORMANCE

## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The staff at Palmetto Middle School continues its efforts to provide our students with a high-quality education. Not only are our students learning the core curriculum, they are also learning how to become good stewards of their community via our commitment to service learning. This year our students served over 8,000 hours of community service through our Palmetto's Finest Program while at the same time supporting/contributing to Operation Care Canned Food Drive, Angel Tree Program (providing Christmas gifts to children), American Cancer Society, Hearts for Haiti, Red Ribbon Week to combat Drug Use, Souls 4 Soles Shoe Drive, PMMS 4th Annual Golf Tournament, and Recycling Rangers.

Additionally, our students are learning of the benefits of the great outdoors through their involvement with the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

We continue our commitment to the South Carolina Department of Education and the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources as a first in the nation "Life's Better Outdoors Natural Resource School." This is a partnership between our school and DNR to teach students the benefits and enjoyment of an active life outdoors. Our students are benefiting physically while at the same time increasing their knowledge of active lifestyles provided by the great outdoors. Students participated and learned how to do many activities, including kayaking, canoeing, hiking, birding, photography, fishing, archery, and skeet shooting/gun safety.

In the classroom, our teachers continue the refinements of their professional learning community by making steady improvement in the instructions provided to the children. What is more notable is how our entire faculty analyzes classroom and statewide test data in striving to find ways to improve student learning. We are happy with the progress our students continue making academically, socially, and now environmentally. As we study and compare our data to that of other schools like ours, we are thrilled to find that our students' test data is first in the state compared to schools like us. These results are in direct relationship to the dedication of our teachers, the support of our parents, and the desire of our students striving to be their best.
