


PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Community, communication, and collaboration were the keys for success for 2009-2010. As we soar to "New Heights," our teachers, training, and technology advances us ever closer towards the realization of our goals. This year's absolute school rating has improved from last year's, and our expectations for next year are equally high. Exceeding our overall school goals reflect the commitment, skill, and resolve of our teaching faculty, which is fully certified and highly qualified. Newly piloted single-gender classes are expanding to 6th grade in 2010-2011, and have been greatly successful in improving the classroom learning environment for this year in 7th & 8th grades.

Our Chorus sang in many venues throughout the year, and our band serenaded the multitudes. Black History Month, Veterans Day, and Holidays' celebrations are just a few of the wonderful performances to which we were treated. Our Drama club presented "Beauty and the Beast" on February 22.

Hawks sports teams finished their seasons with great records. Our statistics show that students who play school sports go on to graduate high school at a greater rate than any other segment of the student population. We annually present the best school athlete award in each sport. Community outreach has been advanced by networking through our local churches, family nights, PTO meetings, and our SIC. Our disaster relief efforts were fruitful, as we collected over 500 pairs of jeans and \$2,500.00 in cash for earthquake victims in Haiti.

The Veterans Day Guest speaker was Theresa Hicks, whose son was killed in action overseas. The audience watched a slide show displaying pictures of men and women who devote their lives to defending our nation. In celebration of Black History Month, New Heights hosted Carolyn Evans, an actress and professional story-teller, who delivered a moving performance about Harriet Tubman and the Underground Railroad.

Now in its second year, our PTO family night programs promote fellowship and networking between parents and our faculty. Our PTO Family Night was highlighted as a "Best Practice" in the Pee Dee region.

Best Selling Author and America's Most Popular Speaker on Parenting and Family Issues, Dr. John Rosemond served as guest speaker for the PTO Family Night.

The New Heights news team published five articles in the Pageland Progressive Journal to inform the community of the events at New Heights.

Fifty professionals from the community presented their careers in New Heights classrooms. Miss South Carolina, Kelly Sloan, visited New Heights on October 14 during Spirit Week.

This year we had five 8th grade students who are eligible for the Duke TIP program. Last year NHMS raised \$ 2000.00 for the American Cancer society. For the St. Jude Math-a-thon we raised \$ 2431.00 for St. Jude's Children's hospital.

Communication with our parents is being enhanced through our website and blackboard connected phone messaging service. The school orientations are being expanded to include seventh and eighth grade for the 2009 2010 school year. Our spirit rock is in its second year and continues to be a fun way for parents, teachers, and students to express school spirit through life's special moments.
