


PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The New 3 R's: Read, Research, Reward - the 2009-10 theme for Middle School of Pacolet - proved successful.

Students and faculty met the challenge of reading every day to complete 2,112 books, an average of 9.5 books per student. Research papers were written with increased complexity and length at each grade level.

Students had many opportunities to earn recognition ranging from honor roll to SPEAR rewards for positive behaviors; from Breakfast of Champions, for demonstrating good character, to Team Time, for meeting behavior expectations; from individual teacher recognitions to reading incentives; students were rewarded for doing their job successfully.

Six MSP students were recognized as Junior Scholars; three students were selected to attend the Spartanburg County Scholars Academy; two students were honored as members of the All Region Band; one student was selected to attend the Summer Music Program at the Governor's School for the Arts; and one student was selected as an alternate. MSP students won the District State Superintendent's Essay Contest, Vulcan State Christmas Card Design Contest, and the District Three Young Artist Instrumentalist for middle schools.

As has become tradition, the MSP family supported causes outside of our school with the same energy as we supported those within. Almost \$6000 was collected for Relay for Life, double the amount raised last year. Quarters for Haiti, a canned food drive for Second Presbyterian Food Kitchen, St. Jude's Math-a-thon, Spartanburg Children's Shelter, and Miracle Hill Ministries all benefitted from our giving nature.

Another chapter closed on a tremendous year as we move to celebrate what lies ahead. "Steeped in History, Focused on the Future," our journey continues toward excellence.
