


PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2009-2010 school year proved to be another outstanding year at Fairforest Middle School. FMS students and teachers celebrated many accomplishments this school year. Nineteen eighth-grade students earned the right to be called South Carolina Junior Scholars for excellent performance on the PSAT. FMS art students won several local, regional, and state awards this year. Our seventh grade football team won the Peachtree Conference with a record of six wins and no losses. The FMS chapter of the National Junior Beta Club had over 200 members this year, and Student Council sponsored several service projects and activities. In addition, the FMS Odyssey of the Mind Team finished second at the state level earning them the chance to compete at the World Competition in Michigan.

The faculty and administration of Fairforest Middle School implemented five literacy goals for students. The five goals include reading twenty-five books, writing a research paper, learning reading and writing strategies, participating in enriched language arts classes, and reading and writing frequently in all classes. FMS implemented a school-wide, sustained reading program which allowed students to read for fifteen minutes once a day.

Teachers and administrators at FMS continue to make data-driven decisions to help improve instruction and student achievement. Teachers and administrators use MAP data, PASS scores, and common assessments to analyze student achievement and instruction.

We are extremely appreciative of the support from our students, parents, and the Fairforest community. We look forward to another outstanding year during the 2010-2011 school year.
