



READING – GRADE 4 (2009)




READING – GRADE 8 (2009)





MATH – GRADE 4 (2009)




MATH – GRADE 8 (2009)





REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

At Hilton Head Island Early Childhood Center (HHIECC) we have the privilege and responsibility of being the first school experience for most of our students. Our school is an arts-infused program that is rooted in the Reggio Emilia philosophy, which promotes individual and group inquiry. The initial vision for this school was created over five years ago when the building was designed. We have developed both the physical and the philosophical components of our environment to be a third teacher to our young children. It is our belief that in today's rapidly changing global society, we must adapt, merge, and infuse new methods of teaching in order to succeed. We ensure our success through data analysis, reflection, teamwork, and adopting research-based practices. We inspire and support one another to be both innovative and effective when working with children. We are a dynamic learning community that strives to develop the gifts of every learner.

Hilton Head Island Early Childhood Center is one of four early-childhood centers in Beaufort County School District. Our school includes 430 students: 33% white, 49% Hispanic, 13% black, and 5% other. We have 130 students enrolled in kindergarten and 300 students enrolled in kindergarten.

Our school met academic goals in both reading and math in 2009 and 2010 on the Measure of Academic Performance (MAP) test. In May 2010, 87% of students met or exceeded their growth targets in reading. The same percentage met or exceeded their growth targets in math. This year, 84% of students scored on or above expected growth targets in reading comprehension, indicating they are reading on an early first grade level.

Teachers and parents indicate a high degree of satisfaction and confidence in our school. 100% of teachers completed the school report card survey and reported satisfaction with the school learning environment, social and physical environment, and school-home relations.

This year, the faculty, staff, and students participated in a Healthy Fruit and Vegetables Grant awarded by the South Carolina State Department of Education. Weekly allotments of healthy fruits and vegetables were served and enjoyed by students and parents. The role of healthy nutritional habits in our life throughout the lifespan begins here! We practiced healthy social emotional growth in our development of a schoolwide behavioral management system. Teachers, staff, and parents participated in the Positive Behavior Intervention Support program (PBIS) to reflect on our current practices and to research needs of our students, faculty, and staff at developing more effective schoolwide systems to support positive behaviors in the school. We developed the B.E.S.T.: Be kind, demonstrate Effort, Show kindness, and build Teamwork system to introduce and practice positive school behaviors. Students received "Gotcha" cards when they were caught demonstrating appropriate behaviors. Schoolwide assemblies were held to teach and celebrate successful behaviors throughout the school. Reteach sessions supported students as they improved behaviors.
