



### READING – GRADE 4 (2009)




### READING – GRADE 8 (2009)





### MATH – GRADE 4 (2009)




### MATH – GRADE 8 (2009)





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## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

"Educating Children Takes Everyone" continues to be the motto of Summerton Early Childhood Center. This motto is a reflection of our mission: Educating the "whole child" by partnering with parents and the community. We are proud to announce that Summerton Early Childhood Center has been recognized as a 2009 - 2010 "Red Carpet" School. SECC also received accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

Improving instruction and enhancing student achievement continue to be the focuses at Summerton Early Childhood Center. Our instructional staff, parents, community members, and administrators meet throughout the year, seeking methods to improve instruction and enhance student achievement.

Summerton Early Childhood Center implemented new initiatives during the year that aided in student success and achievement. We adopted a school-wide handwriting program, "Handwriting without Tears" and a school-wide phonics program, "Project Read." We continue to provide our students with research-based STC Kits in Science and best practices in ELA and Math. Students are administered MAP Testing in the Fall and Spring of each year. Benchmark assessments are also administered three times throughout the year. These assessments aid teachers in guiding instruction.

Teachers participated in professional development opportunities by attending the Roper Mountain Science Institute and Math, Science, and Reading Conferences through the Center of Excellence. As a school, we completed our first book study initiative entitled, *What Matters with Struggling Readers*. We implemented the Lenore Anneberg Grant that provided our school with technology equipment and funds to operate an after-school program for grades K-2.

The PTSO had a remarkable year under the leadership of its president. Events sponsored by the PTSO included: Back 2 School Bash, Fall Festival, Donuts for Dads/Muffins for Moms, and Grits for Grannies. The PTSO also sponsored several service learning projects, such as the Haiti Relief Fund, Relay for Life, St. Jude Math-a-thon, and JROTC Canned Food Drive. These events opened the door for parents and the community to become more involved with SECC.

Our future goals are to become nationally accredited through NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children) and to become an Exemplary Writing School. We will begin the self-study portion of NAEYC in the Fall. We continue to solicit your support.
