Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



District Superintendent's Report

Greenwood School District 50 has completed another productive year of providing a high quality educational program to every student in our district! In spite of economic hardships, our faculty and staff have never wavered in delivering the same first-class educational services on a daily basis.

Our district has continued a trend of improved student achievement. SAT scores continue to rise, especially in math. The number of students participating in Advanced Placement (AP) exams is increasing and the number of students' receiving passing scores on these exams has risen.

We are nearing the end of the district's \$150 million building program which produced three new elementary schools, one new middle school, a state-of-the-art high school gymnasium, and additions and expansions at all of our existing facilities. Technology continues to be upgraded district-wide to support the teaching and learning process.

Professional growth is a key component in our district's goal of having a highly effective teacher in every classroom. As a district, we strive to provide authentically engaging lessons in all of our classrooms that meet the needs of individual students each and every day.

District 50 is working to give every child choice in their education, and we are expanding the newly created Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) program to the seventh grade and to include high school students at both high school campuses. After another successful year, we are expanding the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics School (STEMS) to include 6th, 7th, and 8th graders. The Arts, Communication, and Theatre School (ACTS), our oldest magnet program, will continue to offer opportunities for elementary, middle and high school students. Additional district choice options include the Montessori program, single gender programs, the Middle College Program, and early-bird and flexible schedule courses at the Genesis Education Center.

As we continue to make educational progress with our students, we remain committed to making our community aware of this progress by hosting district-wide events, presentations, and informal coffee hours. The Parent Portal allows parents to access the grades and attendance information of their children. Our district website has enhanced and expanded communication between our teachers, staff, parents, and students.

Your ongoing support for our schools and educational programs is essential to the overall success of our district. Working together, we can overcome any obstacle and make a difference in the lives of all our students and our community.
