

## District Superintendent's Report

Clover School District had a banner school year for students, staff and the community. The district continued to enjoy strong financial health throughout 2010-2011. In the fall, the board approved the purchase of 127 acres of land in the Crowders Creek area in preparation for future school expansion. Although the steady growth evident in the last five years waned due to the economy, the district continued to show slight increases in student enrollment from 2009-2010 to 2010-2011. Clover School District hired thirty-seven new teachers, five assistants and saw the promotion of three new principals at the elementary and middle school levels. State budget cuts notwithstanding, the district sustained competitive instructional programs and a comprehensive technology plan across all content areas and grade levels with minimal to no reductions in instructional materials, personnel, or support services.

Most notably, in the spring of 2011, the state released the district and school report cards for all South Carolina schools. Clover School District celebrated an "Excellent" absolute rating and "Excellent" improvement rating for the prior school year's report card. In grades 3-8, Clover schools ranked in the top five school districts in the state for the percentage of students scoring "Met" or "Exemplary" in mathematics. Likewise, in grades 4-7, Clover schools ranked in the top four school districts in the state for the percentage of students scoring "Met" or "Exemplary" in English Language Arts. The senior class of 2011 earned \$6,061,374 in scholarships, with 103 students earning the Life Scholarship, ninety-five students earning the prestigious Palmetto Fellows Scholarship. Fine Arts programs continued to flourish with Clover High School's Choraliers earning their seventh first place title in state choral competition and the Advanced Placement art program completing its inaugural year. Finally, the district implemented the new Western York County Middle College Program at the high school. Twelve juniors and seniors earned college credits on the campus of York Technical College while working on their high school diploma at Clover High School. Based on end-of-year applications, the program is expected to grow next year to over twenty students.

Clover School District also developed a new five-year district strategic plan with the input of administrators, teachers, board members, parents and community volunteers. The plan emphasizes continuous improvement in monitoring student academic growth and teacher effectiveness, increased attention to rigorous coursework in high school and student graduation with career and/or college readiness skills, and targeted initiatives to enhance the safe and nurturing environments within all schools. Through positive collaborative partnerships with families, community, staff, and administration, Clover School District is working to ensure that every child receives relevant, engaging instruction and the support he or she needs to achieve at the highest levels.
