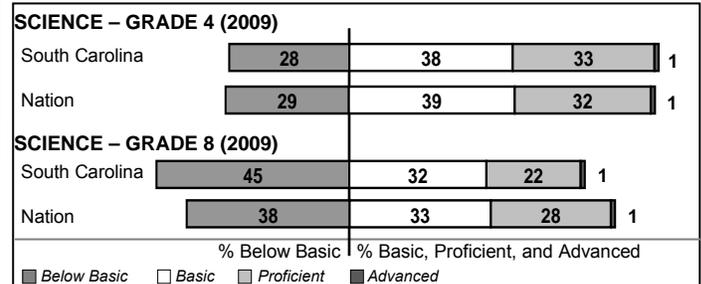
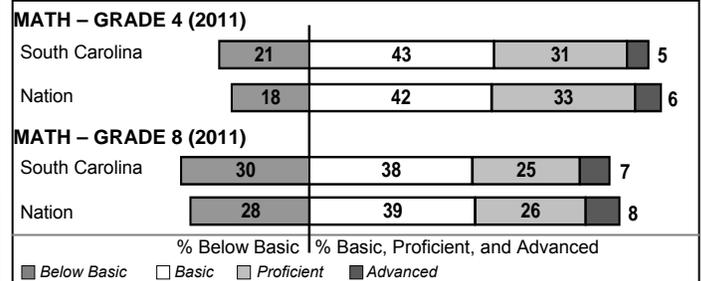
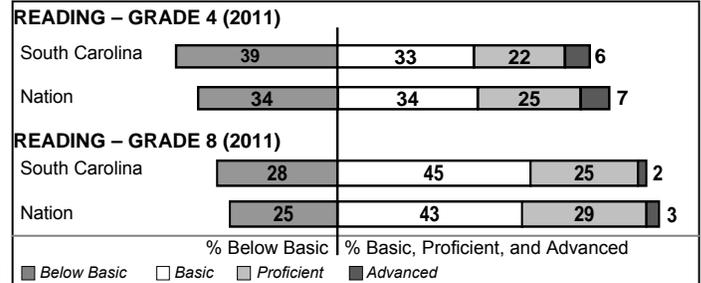

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Our students posted End-of-Course test results in the 2010-2011 year above statewide levels in all four subject areas – Algebra 1, English, Physical Science, and U.S. History and Constitution.

In addition, 10 of our schools earned a total of 14 Palmetto Gold or Silver awards, which recognize them for academic achievement and closing achievement gaps.

This year we saw the expansion of our magnet programs into more of our schools. Joining Calhoun, Varennes, Concord and Nevitt Forest as magnet schools are McLees Academy of Leadership; Lakeside Middle School of Inquiry and Innovation, a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) school; Southwood Academy of the Arts; T.L. Hanna High School, an International Baccalaureate World School, and Westside High School, an Early College Academy.

McCants Middle School is a candidate school for IB status in 2011-2012, and plans on becoming a magnet school for the 2012-2013 school year. The Anderson V Career Campus already serves students from both of our high schools on a choice basis, our two Early Childhood Centers together serve students throughout the district, and the remainder of our schools are in the process of choosing themes and magnet programs.

All of these decisions have brought us closer to our goal of being a district of choice, where students can choose the magnet programs that best fits their needs and interests.

On August 16, 2011 we opened two new middle schools – Robert Anderson and Glenview, in addition to reopening the former Southwood Middle as a new Academy of the Arts. In the summer of 2011 we also renovated our seven oldest elementary schools.

We owe our past progress and our bright future to our students, parents and teachers to be certain; but we also owe it to the Board of Trustees that has championed our progressive programs and the community members that have supported us by volunteering, mentoring our students, and supporting our goal of giving our children the best education possible.
