REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

This has been a great year for Bluffton Elementary. Our Early Childhood Center (ECC) is in full swing. The building is a wonderful place for our kindergarteners and first graders. The portable buildings have been removed and replaced with a bus loop for the ECC and a new soccer field for our 2nd-5th graders. We have a current enrollment of 610 with roughly 204 at the ECC and 406 in the main building.

Bluffton Elementary was recognized for our Animation program by the South Carolina Association for Educational Technology (SCAET) at the annual SC Educational Technology Conference (SC EdTech 2010). We received an honorable mention for innovative technology.

NEW THIS YEAR:

Early Intervention Saturdays—this program focused on parents of little ones between the ages of 2 and 4. The program provided parents with insight into healthy choices, social/emotional/physical growth expectations for each age, academic expectations for entering kindergarten and community resources.

Reading Prize Patrol—To promote the love of reading, the Reading Prize Patrol visited neighborhoods looking for a household where everyone was reading. The PTO sponsored the event and provided a basket of books, pencils, erasers and other fun stuff to the family “caught” reading.

Running Club—Thanks to wonderful parent volunteers, a running club was formed that met once a week. During the meeting, students learned the value of exercise and walked the BLES ECC bus loop to earn “charms.” The charms were given for each mile that a student walked. With our movement in the right direction, BLES appreciates the support of community members, parents, teachers and staff. This overwhelming commitment has helped us continue to grow academically with over 85% of our students on grade level. Working together we have created a strong educational foundation for our students as well that shows in the PASS/MAP growth and the day to day educational focus of the students. Thanks to everyone for another great year and your continued support of our students!
