

## PASS PERFORMANCE

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## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

George I. Pair Elementary School has been a school community committed to promoting excellence while ensuring academic, personal, physical, and social development for children. We have been focused on improving reading, mathematics, writing, science, social studies, and quality experiences in the arts. There have been high expectations for academic achievement and character education standards with an emphasis on celebrating diversity through community-building, enrichment, inclusion, and mainstreaming.

We began this year by celebrating two consecutive years of meeting AYP and exiting school corrective action. This accomplishment was a result of the collaborative efforts by our staff members as a Professional Learning Community. We enjoyed another schoolwide celebration when our fourth grade students became the District Math Bowl Champions.

We have implemented many programs this year to enhance academic instruction, such as the SMART Room for small group Reading instruction, Mad Science partnership, Lunch Buddies, educational partnerships with the University of South Carolina, Midlands Tech, and BC High School, "Reading with the Lady Gamecocks", book fairs, afterschool tutoring, and Response to Intervention. Our efforts to enhance the social development of our students include a partnership with Fellowship of Christian Athletes, student recognition for academic achievements, Student Council service learning projects, breakfast in the classrooms for all students, Red Ribbon Week activities, Jump Rope for Heart, Monthly Pair Patriots, Pinwheels for Peace, and the schoolwide infusion of Habits of Mind.

Our parents have had many opportunities to be involved in their child's educational process through activities such as ESOL Orientations, Class Assignment Days, Grandparents in the Classroom, Family Literacy Night, Poetry Slam, Fall Festival, Chorus Christmas Program, Family Skate Nights, Math/Science Night, Fabulous Fine Arts Night, Volunteer Appreciation Breakfast, Chick-fil-A Nights, Moe's Family Nights, Field Day, Muffins for Moms, and Doughnuts for Dads.

We are proud of the technology available at Pair, including SMARTboards in every classroom, SMART Tables, iPads, iTouches, and numerous software programs that enhance instruction.

We appreciate the support of our parents and community. As George I. Pair Elementary closes its doors as an elementary school this year, our students, families, teachers, and staff look forward to what lies ahead as our children continue their journey towards excellence in Lexington School District Two.
