
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Mayo Elementary School was the proud recipient of the Palmetto Gold Award presented by the State Board of Education and the South Carolina Department of Education for outstanding student academic performance for 2010-2011. Our school was also recognized as a USDA Healthier US School at the Bronze level for implementing a healthier school nutrition environment.

The Spartanburg County District Two Measure of Academic Progress growth goal of 80% or better was achieved by all grades at Mayo Elementary School. The utilization of the Writer's Workshop consultant targeted second grade teachers this school year. Our school staff development program emphasized curriculum guide utilization and introduction to Response to Intervention strategies.

Notable student achievements for the 2010-2011 school year were as follows:

9% of our students received Perfect Attendance Awards. 27% of our students made the "A" Honor Roll. 32% of our students made the "A-B" Honor Roll. 63% of our fifth grade students received the Presidential Award for Academic Excellence.

Family School Nights in Literacy and Mathematics were a huge success. Our PTO upgraded our sound system to improve sound quality for our school programs. Our students were excited by the numerous visits from the Watershed Ecology Center from USC Upstate this school year. Physical Education is incorporating cardio team building through Project Fit America. Look for growth in classroom technology next year.
