


PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

New Ellenton Middle School's faculty, staff, students, community volunteers, and mentors worked collaboratively towards achieving academic excellence this past year. Students were provided a comprehensive, rigorous academic program in conjunction with extracurricular activities which promoted character development and team building skills. The result of this dedication resulted in New Ellenton Middle School meeting the NCLB standards for Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP).

New Ellenton Middle School continuously seeks initiatives to provide the best educational opportunities for all students. Staff members analyze data from a variety of sources to drive decisions on our academic program. New Ellenton Middle School implemented the Making Middle Grades Work Framework for continuous growth in student achievement. Students also had the opportunity to participate in tutorial sessions with all content area teachers and attend Saturday School which is offered twice each year.

A few highlights of our school year include our Quiz Bowl Team earning the title of SC State Middle School Quiz Bowl Champions and the opportunity to travel to Chicago, Illinois to compete in the national competition. English I and Algebra I students had a one hundred percent passing rate on the End of Course Assessments. Two teams placing first place in the South Carolina Stock Market Game. Six students were recognized as South Carolina Junior Scholars.

Our school's PTO and School Improvement Council jointly provide support and resources to our school. The PTO financially supports the school's academic program through their fundraiser efforts. The PTO also sponsors events and volunteers at many school functions. The School Improvement Council involves parents, community members, and teachers in the planning, monitoring and evaluating of our school program to ensure continuous improvement. Both the PTO and SIC meet regularly.
