




### READING – GRADE 8 (2011)

## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The mission of Southside Middle School is to maximize the potential of all students in order to prepare them to become productive and responsible citizens who are able to succeed in an ever-changing society. Southside Middle School staff and partners set out this year to make a positive impact. The following are a few of the initiatives and accomplishments we achieved:

- Our school continues to use data to drive staff development and to select instructional practices.
  - Teams/departments documented discussions regarding instructional strategies, challenges, and how data is used to guide instruction.
  - Students participated in the After-school Program and 21st Century program.
  - Student academic growth was monitored using data from MAP.
  - Faith based mentors continued mentoring students.
  - Teachers began posting POD cast of lessons taught on teacher websites to enhance instruction.
  - We continued our live morning show where we shared daily Words of Wisdom.
  - Our school received a \$1500.00 fitness award from Fuel up to Play 60.
  - We hosted our Annual Swinging with Seniors Event, and SC History Day, which were both a huge success. We had over 538 senior citizens join us for food and entertainment.
  - Our Consumer Science students and eighth grade history students hosted these events.
  - Bonnie Shaw was selected as the 2009-2010 Teacher of the Year.
  - The mentoring programs B.A.D.D. and Delta Academy were implemented. Advisors Jimmy Wilson and Schanell Montgomery lead students in team building activities, and community based service projects.
  - Our Fifth Annual Veteran's Day program was a great success.
  - Over 300 students participated in the "Let's Move Campaign" sponsored by First Lady Michelle Obama.
  - Southside Middle became a National Healthy School's Award Winner.
