**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



**District Superintendent's Report**

2011-12 was a very good year for the School District of Oconee County. This was true for academics, capital improvements, and finances.

**PREPARING STUDENTS: ACADEMICS**

The students in SDOC excelled on all metrics used to assess district performance by federal and state measures. Students at the high school level met or exceeded state performance on the 10th grade HSAP test, and ACT performance in our district was among the best in our state (6th highest performing district among the 83 districts). Students at the elementary and middle school level continue to perform better than their peers across the nation on MAP which is a norm-referenced test. The MAP assessment in math was especially strong with every grade level exceeding the national mean score. Please take a closer look at the scores contained within this annual report and you'll see that students in Oconee County are being successful academically.

**BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE: CAPITAL PROJECTS**

SDOC students are able to learn in buildings that facilitate the instructional process. In partnership with Oconee County and a federal grant, all schools were connected to new fiber optic network enabling greater internet speed. Seneca High, West-Oak High, and Tamassee-Salem Middle/High received major additions and renovations. Progress is being made on the new Walhalla High Campus that will open in 2015. All of this has been done without an increase in debt service millage.

**COMMUNITY STEWARDSHIP: DISTRICT FINANCES**

SDOC has operated with a flat budget over the past four years. The majority of funds come from local sources (51%), and state (37%) and federal (12%) round out the rest of the revenues that pays for the operational costs of the difference. The goal is to provide the citizens with a good return on their investment. We're proud to serve this community in leadership roles, and our goal is to provide our students with an excellent education that prepares them for life beyond high school. Thank you for your support because in Oconee County "Education is Everybody's Business."
