



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Beaufort County School District Family:

Thanks to the hard work and creativity of students, families, educators and school partners, 2011-12 was another year of solid improvements. Student achievement improved on state and national norm-referenced tests. Ninety-three percent of schools were rated Excellent, Good or Average on state School Report Cards, up from 59 percent in 2008 when Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) tests were introduced. For the first time since Report Cards were first published more than 10 years ago, no Beaufort County school was rated At-Risk. Four were rated Excellent.

BCSD met 31 of its 33 federal goals (94 percent) under the Federal No Child Left Behind Act, up from 21 of 33 goals (64 percent) five years ago. Also, 76 percent of Beaufort students passed both sections of the high school exit exam on their first attempt, an improvement over 2010's passing rate of 74 percent and 2009's passing rate of 72 percent. A record 27 schools – up from only three in 2007 -- earned 34 state Palmetto Gold or Silver awards for overall performance or for closing achievement gaps. On national MAP tests, our students scored above the national average in all grades and in all subjects except for Grade 2 reading. Beaufort Middle and Hilton Head Island High won Palmetto's Finest Awards, making Beaufort only the third district in the award's 34-year history to have two winners in the same year. Whale Branch Early College High School's first graduates included students who also earned two-year associate's degrees through a partnership with the Technical College of the Lowcountry.

For the third consecutive year, the district operated without a tax increase while maintaining an exemplary credit rating that saves taxpayer dollars. Eighty positions were eliminated, bringing the total number eliminated over the past three years to 169. The number of district office staff has been reduced by one-third. Innovative conservation practices saved more than a million kilowatt-hours of electricity over 2006 levels despite the addition of building space. Water use decreased from 43.8 million gallons in 2009 to 33.2 million gallons in 2011 thanks to water-saving technology. Refinancing a bond for school maintenance saved about \$2.4 million. Another highlight was Beaufort County's national recognition as one of the America's Promise Alliance's 100 Best Communities for Young People. Everywhere you looked in 2011-12, there was evidence that "Learning Leads the Way" in Beaufort County.
