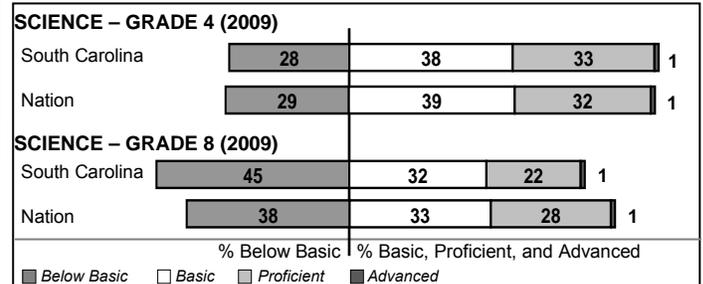



We implemented a new style of administration at the Pk-12 Complex which included a PK-12 principal, three instructional leaders and three behavior modification specialists.
