



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

The Williamsburg County School District is a school system focused on implementing ideas and supporting practices to serve the best interest of students and the community alike. And in that regard, every effort has been, and continues to be, made to move the district on a focused path to higher standards and greater performance results for students, staff, and administrators.

In November of 2011, the system was visited by a national team of educational evaluators (AdvancEd), with the results being the accreditation of every school in the Williamsburg County Public School District. The districtwide process was recommended to the Board of Trustees as a way of working to bring the district's schools together as a school system, rather than having the emphasis on individual schools, and having the system function as a system of schools. The evaluation process, as implemented, also provided substantial financial savings to the school district, as it worked to stabilize its financial footing.

The system is also continuing to experience academic gains with most schools demonstrating improvement. Greater gains are being experienced for the 2012 school year as a result of consistent and continuous professional development for district and school level administrators, and school based instructional staff. The district received seven (7) combined Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards for Excellence in Closing Achievement Gaps, and/or Outstanding Student Academic Performance. The district also received Academic Achievement Flags, (Four Gold, and one Silver), for display at the local school level. Additionally, the district's first Comprehensive Choice Program was developed, with the implementation of the district's Magnet School of the Arts. Auditions for the district's magnet program were conducted in February of 2012. The system also initiated its first Hall of Fame Scholarship Gala on May 18, 2012, with the purpose of recognizing outstanding graduates of, and contributors to, the Williamsburg County Public Schools. Funds received from the Gala will be used to provide scholarships for graduates of the school district who have enrolled in two or four year colleges. It is a way of saying to the students of this school district that the Board and System, as a whole, values education, and will support their efforts to become productive, contributing citizens.

The district was also pleased to be acknowledged as having one of the ten (10) South Carolina student qualifiers of the prestigious Gates Millennium Scholarships. Additionally the district exceeded its 2011 senior class scholarship record, and envisions the continuation of that trend for the 2013 school year.

Overall, significant progress has been made, but there is still much to be done. We are grateful for the support of the Williamsburg County School Board of Trustees, the Williamsburg County School District Family, and the entire Williamsburg County Community. The strength and success of a school district does not rest on the shoulders of a single individual, but on the total commitment of its citizens, to ensure the provision of quality educational opportunities for all of its children.
