



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Rock Hill Schools continued its journey on The Rock Hill Climb to achieve the district's mission of providing all students with challenging work that authentically engages them in the learning process. As a part of this journey, the district continued to address the decline in state funding for education while protecting the classroom. This included multiple cost-saving changes to our processes as well as budget reductions. District staff and students continued to bring recognition to their schools and to the district. This included staff members who served as South Carolina's Teacher of the Year; selected as the National High School Assistant Principal of the Year; named Principal of the Year by the S.C. International Reading Association; and chosen as S.C.'s Spanish Teacher of the Year. We had 21 schools to receive Palmetto Gold or Silver awards; all three AFJROTC units were named Distinguished Units with Merit; a high school literary magazine was named Best in State; a high school newspaper was selected Best in its Class; our high school bands and choruses were ranked at the top in state competitions; and a high school football team won the 3A state championship. Individual students became state champions in wrestling, swimming and track; three students earned first chairs in the S.C. All-State Honors Band; and many of our middle and high school students qualified for National History Day competition in Washington, D.C. In addition, the districts school supply drive and the Back-the-Pack weekend food program for students in need met with great success. Our district will continue to hold dear our professional code. We will put students first, nurture relationships, work together for a shared vision, grow professionally, and continuously find ways to improve.
