**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



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**Report of Principal and School Improvement Council**

We are blessed to be a part of the Sangaree Intermediate School Family! We have such a talented staff, hardworking students and supportive parent population. Our teachers continue to combine traditional educational approaches with current research and innovative programs to provide a well-rounded education for our children.

As we reflect on the 2011-12 school year, we are proud of the things we have accomplished. We were very excited to be awarded the Palmetto Gold Award by the South Carolina Department of Education for outstanding student achievement on the PASS Test. We were also presented the Palmetto Gold Award for closing the achievement gap for underperforming students. Over seventy students were awarded "PASS PRO" T-shirts for scoring "Exemplary" on the PASS Test in all four subjects! Our students and staff celebrated being recognized as a Channel 2 "Cool School" and enjoyed being seen on the local news program!

The 3 R Character Education Program highlighted students being respectful, responsible and ready to learn. Students earned tags and t-shirts each month to proudly wear around school. We continued to provide a strong emphasis in the arts as a result of the funding through the Distinguished Arts Program Grant. These additional funds provided us week long residencies with artists such as Storyteller Tim Lowry, Atlantic Coast Theatre, Andrew Worthem. The DAP Grant also provided our fourth grade students an opportunity to visit the Gibbs Art Museum in downtown Charleston. Other highlights this year included: Honor Roll Luncheons, Come Read with Me, PTA Dances, Career Day, Chorus Concerts, Clubs, Performing Arts Plays, Red Ribbon Week, Family Field Night by Journey Church, Living Literature Day, SRI Mentoring Program, library visits by Calhoun, Jonathan Green Celebration, Rally for Reading, Roscoe Reader Celebrations, Breakfast/Lunch Buddies, and The Principal's Multiplication Bee.

We participated in many community outreach programs such as the Jump Rope for Heart, American Heart Association Blood Drive and Kids Who Care. We were also very proud to foster student leadership through Student Council, Patriot Pals and National Elementary Honor Society. We would like to thank our PTA, School Improvement Council and parent community for your support this year! We continue to work toward continuous improvement in all that we do!

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
