**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

The Blue Ridge Elementary School Family of students, faculty, staff, parents, and community rallied for a fantastic 2011-12 school year. Our staff collaborated to address academic strengths and weaknesses by using data to improve student achievement. The percentage of students scoring met or above on 2011 Writing and Math PASS test improved. Students also improved in all areas of MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) Testing: Reading, Math and Language Usage. Through professional development and research on Engaged Readers and Writers, Blue Ridge also showcased 4 High Literacy High Progress model classrooms and one 1 to 1 iPad class.

As we journeyed through the year, the Blue Ridge Elementary School Family was honored to receive many accolades and recognitions including 2012 Safe Schools Award. Blue Ridge is the recipient of a 21st Century Grant which serves 90 students in our after school program, Club L.E.A.P. (Learning Enhanced through the Arts and Physical Fitness) These students receive extra academic support in Reading and Math while learning about financial literacy, the Arts, and living a healthy lifestyle. With support from our community partners, Blue Ridge received Staple's Recycling Grant to kick off our school-wide recycling efforts. Blue Ridge is also a recipient of Clemson University's T.I.G.E.R. Read Grant. Fourteen of our students were inducted to our very first Junior Beta Club. Our Lego League Team advanced to the state competition. One student earned a spot on the State's Honor Chorus. Our students earned 3rd place in the spirit competition at Special Olympics.

Learning for BRE students does not end in May. All students in grades K-5 received 12 books for Summer Reading! Our Ready, Set, Go! Early Childhood program for rising Kindergarten and 1st grade students will operate 4 weeks during the summer. Our partnership with Clemson University's Call Me Mister Program afforded us a 6-week Summer Enrichment Camp for students in grades 3-5.

Blue Ridge's volunteer program comprised of parents, retirees, high school, Clemson University students and other community members logged in 3,780 hours. Our school is fortunate to have dedicated faculty, staff, parents, and community members that are committed to our students' success!

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## ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
