Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

For the 2011-2012 school year, Lockett Elementary School provided all students with the instructional resources to help them achieve at higher levels. Our faculty and staff were focused on each child's particular learning needs and our parents and community members continued to provide assistance in many areas of our school. Lockett Elementary students became more involved in computer assisted instruction through the use of BrainPop and IXL. BrainPop provided students with access from home or school in the areas of reading, science, and social studies. IXL is also web-based and provided students in all grades with activities to challenge their critical thinking skills. This program is also aligned with the new Common Core State Standards, (CCSS) that will be more rigorous and help our students to be more career and college ready. Our Response to Intervention (RTI) efforts include the use of Academy of Reading, Voyager, and Leveled Literacy Intervention (LLI) for targeted students.

LES has won the Palmetto Silver Award, Red Carpet Award, and Orangeburg County Summer Reading Award for the past several years. Our students have been involved in the South Carolina Geography Bee and there were five winners of the prestigious Presidential Academic Achievement Award this year.

Parents and family members are encouraged to participate in our Fall Festival, PTSO student performances, Grandparent's Day activities, Veteran's Day Parade, Award's Day programs, Field Day, and other special events. Community leaders helped us to initiate a student mentoring program for some of our young males that we hope to expand in the future.

The challenges to overcome in meeting our student achievement goals are decreased funding levels per student, large class sizes in upper grades, and limited instructional personnel. However, everyone involved will continue to provide the best instruction possible based on each student's individual needs. We welcome your suggestions and your support is always welcomed and appreciated.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
