**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Webber Elementary School, a Palmetto Gold and Silver Award Winning Red Carpet School, continues to live up to that reputation as a jewel in the Richland School District One crown.

This past year, our students' academic improvement earned the school two (2) Palmetto Silver awards. Our most significant increase was shown in the area of writing. As a matter of fact, Webber Elementary 5th grade students ranked #3 in the district in writing. Our school was also represented at the Lt. Governors Young Writer's Conference. There were fifteen (15) 4th and 5th grade students who qualified for the Duke University academic Duke TIP program, the largest number we've ever had to qualify for the program. Additionally, 4 students were selected in the MEGSSS program as gifted secondary math scholars. 5th grade was also represented at the Regional Science Fair with one of the team's project placing in the finals at the regional.

We continue our efforts to address health and fitness issues as shown by our recognition as a silver award winning in the National Healthy School program, and the continued participation in the school-wide fresh fruits and vegetable program.

Our parents, PTA, SIC, and our business partners continue to be a source of unwavering support for the school. In addition to the numerous past recognitions for their work with Webber, International Paper, Inc. was named the 2012 Business Partner of the Year in Richland One. Their latest collaborative project involves the establishment of an outdoor classroom scheduled for completion during the summer of 2012. Even more significant is the 15-year commitment as Lunch Buddies to numerous students during this period of time.

The Alumni Association funded scholarships for many of our students to participate in out-of-state field experiences along with the vibrant PTA supporting student activities throughout the year. We culminated the final year of the 21st Century Grant funds by providing a trip to Washington DC for 4th and 5th grade students at the end of the year.

Again, this year our faculty and staff supported the community by earning the highest per capita award for giving in this year's United Way campaign.

As we celebrate the achievements of our students, faculty and staff, we challenge our parents, community and friends to visit us often and to continue their support in our pursuit of excellence in teaching and learning here at Webber Elementary School.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
