Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Williamsburg County Magnet School of the Arts' goal is to provide the highest quality instruction in academic standards while infusing the arts. This year, students in grades K-6 were served in the Arts program. The total school enrollment was 413, 4K-6 grades. The components of the Arts program were: Dance, Visual Arts, Drama, Creative Writing, Vocal ensemble, Instrumental Ensemble, Strings, Piano and Technology. WCMSA provided a number of instructional programs for students who were not meeting their academic goals. These programs included two 21st Century after-school programs, and Classworks curriculum lab. All lessons and activities were aligned with the State standards, as we move toward the common core standards. The RBHS (Rehabilitative Behavioral and Health Services) teachers, as well as the Child Development Education Pilot Program (CDEPP), entered its fifth year and showed much academic promise for our students. In addition, a full time guidance counselor continues to provide academic, social and personal assistances for our children.

Other programs and activities that were provided to help build our students' character and prepare them to survive in a constantly changing and diverse world included: the Parenting Program, Fall Fest, Hat Parade, Field Day, Kindergarten Etiquette and Spelling Bee. Our Foster Grandparents Program, through the local Vital Aging Commission, allows our older generation to pass knowledge and character to our younger generation. WCMSA would like to thank our parents and community members for their effortless support that they have shown us this school year. We could not have accomplished many of our goals without them. The mission of Williamsburg County Magnet School of the Arts is to provide the highest quality instruction in academic standards while infusing the arts, so that each student can achieve his/her fullest potential, work to become a lifelong learner, and become a productive member of the community.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
