

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The mission of the Powersville Elementary community is to strive to promote life-long learning in every student and to ensure a positive, challenging, and safe learning environment. This mission is exemplified in our school motto, "Powersville Elementary, P R I D E: Producing Responsible Individuals while Developing Excellence." Character Education is essential in developing responsible students. Each day a new character word is introduced by our news anchors on our student operated news program, WTLP. We're The Lion Pride network, and our teachers integrate those character words into their classroom instruction.

Our theme for the 2011 -2012 school year was "Gill's Galaxy of Learners: Blasting Off to Success". The school was decorated in a space theme, complete with our own mission control and navigating astronaut. Each teacher's classroom was transformed into his/her own "launch pad" from which the students began their journey! Our "Shoot for the Stars" bulletin board with examples of students exemplifying good character, our "Citizen of the Month" display and our grade level displays of student work were favorites throughout the year.

Powersville Elementary worked together and achieved great things this year! We are very proud to have been named as a 2010 National Blue Ribbon School! This year we received the Palmetto Gold Award for both general performance and for closing the achievement gap.

Our students excelled in other areas also: Anderson Independent Mail Halloween Writing Contest 2nd and 3rd place winners
Over \$5000 was contributed to Jump Rope for Heart
Students/parents/staff contributed to Toys for Tots and our own Lion's Share Christmas Project which assists needy families with Christmas
Student Service Council raised money to assist a school in Alabama rebuild their playground that was devastated by a tornado, sent cards to a veterans' nursing home for Veteran's Day, sent Christmas cards to a local children's hospital, and supported Relay for Life
Our school raised over \$3500 for Relay for Life
4th and 5th grade Chorus performed for our school; 5th grade strings program
Third graders went mining for Treasures, Fourth graders enjoyed an Explorer Day, and Fifth graders experienced different eras of our history
Powersville Postal Pride, our school postal system delivers mail twice per week, written by students, staff, and parents, with in the school
