REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Barnwell Elementary School is a rural school serving 603 students in grades four through six.

The dedicated faculty of Barnwell Elementary School uses data from MAP, PASS, and common assessments to drive the curriculum of South Carolina Standards. Data rooms are located on each hall where students' progress is monitored and studied.

Barnwell Elementary School continues to increase the technology available and its usage. Several document cameras and SMART Response Systems were added this year.

The 2011-2012 school year was abuzz with student activity. Our fourth grade students participated in the G.R.E.A.T. program. They also enjoyed a visit with guest speaker Meteorologist Ben Tanner of WIS-TV. SCE&G presented the program Safety City to the classes as well. The fifth grade students participated in the first Culture Day at Barnwell Elementary School. Several of the classes visited the Ruth Patrick Science and Education Center in Aiken. Students especially enjoyed a field study to see the play, The Diary of Anne Frank. D.A.R.E. was also a part of the 5th studies. The fifth graders enjoyed the field study to Barrier Island, too. The sixth graders participated in Career Day. Several of the classes visited the Savannah River Ecology Lab. All of the students participated in various clubs during the year.

Barnwell Elementary School was also a Farm to School Grant recipient. Students participated in cultivating a garden and learning about nutrition and agriculture. The cafeteria served various South Carolina grown fruits and vegetables throughout the year.

We continue to work closely with our PTO and SIC in sponsoring family events such as the Fall Carnival, BINGO nights, and other family events.
