

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Greenbrier Elementary: The School of Kindness provides a caring and supportive environment. This caring community requires students and teachers to take active roles in shaping the culture and environment of the classroom, as well as of the school at large.

Greenbrier is an environment where students feel safe physically, emotionally and intellectually. We believe caring relationships in school allow students and staff members to feel safe to take risks and participate without fear of ridicule. By learning how to actively Take Time to Be Kind (TTTBK) through use of good manners, performing random acts of kindness, and helping others when they are struggling, students promote a climate of care and respect. Kindness Patrols help promote the vision of TTTBK by modeling kindness and leading school community service projects. By learning how to actively TTTBK, students and faculty help create a culture of support and acceptance.

Our mission at Greenbrier Elementary is to become seekers of learning, models of excellence, and builders of character. Greenbrier Elementary is a public school in southern Greenville County located in the Mauldin community. Our school, home to over 800 wonderful students, has heterogeneously grouped classes in kindergarten through grade five. We have a 4K classroom and five self-contained special education classes. Specialists in art, music, physical education, and library science teach all students. The academic curriculum is both meaningful and appropriately challenging for all students. With ongoing staff development, strategies for differentiating instruction are presented and shared at grade level meetings to ensure that teachers are meeting the learning needs of their students. Academic support is given to students who struggle with learning concepts. Formative common assessments provide data for the teachers to identify students' learning needs and differentiate instruction. Common grade level planning provides collaboration for curricular decisions that address and support student needs. These strategies ensure that every student is valued and respected and every opportunity is given to assist each student to excel, regardless of the learning needs and cultural differences. Modeling

Working together, our Parent Teacher Association (PTA) and School Improvement Council (SIC) along with parents, grandparents, school staff and the community seek to serve the mission of Greenbrier. The partnership between Greenbrier's PTA, SIC, and the community is held in high regard. Through gifts of time and donations, our business partners enable us to host family-friendly events throughout the year and have included Family Fun Nights, where families come together for healthy dinners and engage in fun activities that focus on positive connections.
