
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2011-2012 school year was an excellent year for North Myrtle Beach Elementary School. Our enrollment this year was 667 second and third grade students. Our mission is to provide a rigorous and engaging curriculum that meets the needs of each individual student. We are proud we received the Palmetto Gold Award for overall general performance for the 2011-12 school year. Our focus this year has been to implement a core reading program that includes phonemic awareness, phonics, comprehension, vocabulary and fluency. We have fully implemented the Imagine IT! Reading program in both second and third grade. We also focused on small group intensive reading interventions for at risk students. Through the use of The Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) assessments, we assessed the needs and growth of every child. We had significant professional development on the utilization of workstations and the Everyday Math curriculum. Small group math instruction was provided to students who were at risk. NMBE teachers focused on data teams to collaborate and determine the needs of all students and provided each student with differentiated instruction. In the area of personal and social development, NMBE offers classroom guidance lessons, service learning projects, Life-skill leader programs and Positive Behavior Interventions and Support. Our school has zero tolerance for bullying. NMBE participated in many service learning projects such as the American Heart Association Jump Rope for Heart, American Cancer Society, Relay for Life, Ronald McDonald House, United Way, The Salvation Army, Helping Hands and the March of Dimes. The success of any school requires the support of an active PTO, faithful volunteers, generous business partners and involved parents. Over 35 business partners provided incentives for students and staff, and over 245 faithful volunteers in our community provide assistance to teachers and students. We invite you to Soar to Success with us in the 2012- 2013 school year.
