

Oakway Intermediate serves 215 students in grades 4 and 5. The uniqueness of being an intermediate school allows us to focus our environment, activities and programs on this age student. Our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support program allows for establishing expectations and providing incentives to the students. The PBIS matrix focuses on reinforcing student positive behaviors of Respect, Organization, Cooperation, Knowledge, and Self-control (R.O.C.K.S.).

Teachers implement technology in their daily instruction. Technology has been expanded so that classrooms have a variety of instructional technology. Teachers each have a webpage established for their classes to help with communication between home and school.

Teachers are committed to student growth and achievement. Using all data available, an in-depth analysis of each individual student's strengths, weaknesses and performance is carried out. This study provides information to help improve instruction based on student needs for the purpose of increased student learning.

Professional development continues to be a key component in our success. Our teachers received training in various areas in order to help meet the ever-changing needs of our students.
