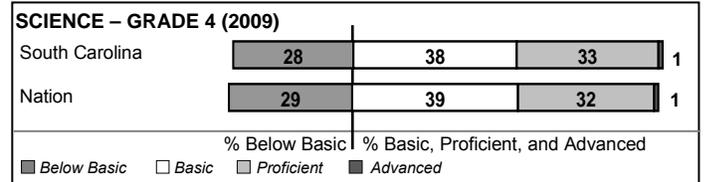


PASS PERFORMANCE
