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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Cane Bay High School (CBHS) just graduated its first four-year class, and the year has been filled with many accomplishments. The dedication of the teachers and staff as well as the commitment and support of the community have been instrumental in our student successes. Recognitions, awards and accomplishments for the 2011-2012 school year include but are not limited to the following: CBHS bands, chorus and orchestra scored straight superiors at concert festival, numerous visual art winners, state Deca winner, state student council officer, JROTC drill meet competitions, robotics competition, Quest academic competition winners, etc.

Our students were busy in and out of the classroom with many athletic accomplishments to include: 3rd round playoffs for our varsity football team, state winners in wrestling and girls' tennis, 4th consecutive region championship in girls track, state champion high jumper, 2nd consecutive region championship in baseball, etc. Other sports that achieved play off status include boys and girls basketball, girls' soccer, softball, volleyball, wrestling, etc. What a busy sports year!

In trying to prepare our students for the next step, we have held many SAT/ACT boot camps. As a result of these labors both academically and athletically our senior class earned right at 7 million in scholarships! Fourteen athletes signed athletic scholarships as well.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
