Ninety Six High

During the 2011-2012 school year, Ninety Six High School (NSHS) earned the Palmetto Gold Award for academic achievement. NSHS was only one of a handful of high schools in the state who met AYP in 2012. NSHS was also recognized as a Bronze Medal Award Winner by the US News and World Report as one of the "Best High Schools in America." In our classrooms, students read for a total of 745,379 minutes. During the 2011-2012 school year, the number of business partners increased by 20 businesses to 170 and the number of volunteer hours doubled to 2,940. 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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
