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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Provost Academy South Carolina (PASC) is a public virtual charter high school serving approximately 1100 students in grades 9-12. PASC opened in the 2009-2010 school year as a member of the South Carolina Public Charter School District and has completed its third year of operation. PASC offers a rigorous and challenging curriculum to high school students across the entire state. All courses meet state and national standards while providing flexibility to meet the needs of each individual student. PASC provides online course work that is taught by certified and highly qualified educators. Advisors, guidance counselors, parents and students communicate regularly via Blackboard collaborate, telephone calls, and messaging. Courses are offered on a traditional year-long high school schedule or a semester block schedule based upon the needs of the student. Students are offered courses in foreign languages, advanced-placement, and honors. We are proud that we have 135 graduates this school year with 19 of them being Life Scholars. We had a National Merit Commended Scholar in this year’s graduating class. Our students participated in several service projects and field trips around the state during the school year. This gave the students, parents and staff an opportunity to meet face-to-face. Our students also produce a hard bound yearbook. We also have numerous clubs and organizations for our students that include: National Honor Society, a photography club, a book club, an art club and a history club. All students participated in state testing, taking HSAP and the End-of-Course assessments. We also held a graduation ceremony in June. Our main focus is to provide a rigorous and relevant education to ensure the success of all of our students.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
