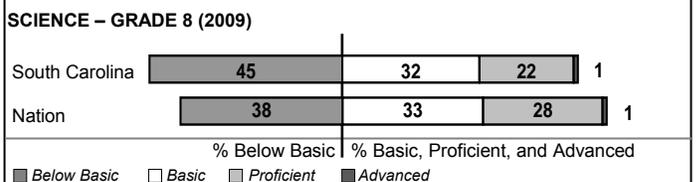

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

As Berkeley High School celebrates its one hundred year anniversary, it is still igniting, in every student, the passion for lifelong learning which it has inspired in every student who has passed through the doors at dear old Berkeley High. Through dynamic instruction, creative partnerships, and exceptional support, we foster opportunities for each student to build a legacy of success.

To help create opportunities for our students, BHS is proud to have received the ACCENT, High Schools That Work, Teen Lead Character Education, Jobs for America's Graduates, Teachers of Critical Language, Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education (FIPSE), and Teachers of Critical Language Program grants. The following programs have been implemented at BHS to assure challenging, rigorous learning opportunities for all: International Baccalaureate Programme, Scholars Academy, STAR Academy, International Business Academy, Mandarin Chinese classes, Six plus One Writing Traits, Writing across the Curriculum, MAP Testing, Accelerated Reader, Academic Learning Centers, the Academic Coaching Center, SAT/ACT prep courses, SAT tutorial program, HSAP Campaign, internship programs including Career Studies and Service Learning, Career Counseling, and an Academic Incentive Card Program.

The first class to graduate with the option of an International Baccalaureate Diploma will do so in this year, 2013. We have also entered into a partnership with Trident Technical College to align our CTE programs with TTC's corresponding curriculum to make our students college and career ready when they leave Berkeley High School. At the end of the year, our students will be taking a competency test in their CTE classes, which can earn them college credits if they decide to attend TTC.

Berkeley High School has continued to implement a highly successful tutorial program called the Academic Coaching Center. Students are recommended for tutoring by their teachers and receive extra help from certified teachers from certified teachers in the areas of math, science, social studies, and ELA. Based on previous years' statistics, students who attended the ACC for five weeks increased their overall class grade by an average of fifteen percentage points. This year we have added retired teachers who are still certified to our ACC staff, providing our students even more opportunities to work with highly effective tutors to help with their mastery of material.

BHS is accredited by the internationally-recognized mark of quality, AdvancED District Accreditation. We continue to work toward the goals of our School Renewal Plan, ACCENT, and High Schools That Work site development and implementation plans. Approximately sixty-five percent of our faculty received continuing contracts, and teachers regularly attended professional growth conferences, workshops, and classes. We continue to build our Professional Learning Community at BHS. Several teachers at BHS are pursuing National Board Certification as well as higher-level degrees.

To enhance student achievement, BHS appreciates the active parent and community involvement that is evidenced through numerous booster clubs and volunteer services. These clubs include groups which sponsor academics, athletics, band, and AFJROTC and provide our students with further opportunities and incentives to achieve.

Through these challenging programs, student support systems, and cooperative partnerships, the BHS staff and community at large are working together to empower each student to build a legacy of success.
