

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

During 2011-2012, James F. Byrnes High School continued our commitment to excellence.

Our school was awarded the Palmetto Gold Award for both general performance and for closing the achievement gap. School averages for the SAT and the ACT increased along with scores on the SC HSAP, SC End-of-Course Exams, and College Board Advanced Placement (AP) exams. 207 Byrnes students took 312 AP exams in 2011, bringing our school totals to higher levels than ever before. As a result, thirty-four students earned AP Scholar Awards in recognition of their exceptional achievement on AP exams. The number of students taking dual credit courses increased as well as the number of students completing work-based or service learning experiences.

Byrnes was the first high school in Spartanburg County to participate in College Application Day. Twenty college admissions counselors joined us on our campus in October as our entire staff came together to assist 370 seniors begin or submit a college application.

Our Rebel football team won an impressive eleventh State Championship and the baseball team won their third consecutive Upper State Championship. Fine arts programs won numerous competitions across the state including the Rebel Theatre Company which placed first in the SC Theater Association's State Competition and Rebel Regiment marching band which placed fourth in the SC Band Director's Association 5A State Marching Band Championship. Our student-produced yearbook, "Souvenirs," received an All-State rating, the highest award category.

Student service to the community remained a priority for our school and, once again, the American Cancer Society and Relay for Life named Byrnes the number one fundraising school for the fourth consecutive year. Additionally, the Byrnes "Lake Sweep" team won third place this year at Lake Bowen, collecting 50,000 pounds of waste--which equates to much cleaner drinking water.

Of course, our commitment to excellence is a result of a strong partnership between Byrnes and our community. We are proud of our many successes from this year and look for many more in the future.
