

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Crestwood High School serves a diverse population that comes from rural areas, the suburbs of Sumter, and Shaw Air Force Base. We meet the needs of our students by providing a wide range of educational opportunities incorporating both traditional teaching strategies and innovative instructional techniques to engage the learner. Crestwood students have access to additional educational opportunities through dual credit college courses that are offered on the school campus to qualified seniors and juniors. They also have access to the vocational courses at the Sumter County Career Center. We are a part of the High Schools That Work initiative and are also in the process of providing Common Core standards training for our staff. Implementation of Common Core standards will both enable our students to compete with greater success on national and international levels and simplify any transfers the students may make from district to district or from state to state.

As part of our ongoing improvement initiative, we have implemented the Knights' Round Table, a forty-five minute block each day devoted to literacy, special tutorials, credit recovery, and other activities. In addition, we have two career specialists to help guide the students in making informed decisions about the future.

Crestwood won a Palmetto Gold award for excellence and another Palmetto Gold award for narrowing the achievement gap for minorities, as announced during the 2011-2012 school year. In addition, we were awarded a \$245,000 grant for innovation in serving at-risk students. Our students have gained recognition through competitions on the local, state, national, and international levels, winning awards in academics as well as co-curricular and athletic activities. The entire school program reflects the school mission statement, "Crestwood High School: Keeping Academics and Citizenship First and Foremost."
